6	2008	Chateau de Pennautier Rouge (Cabardès) <i>Predominantly derived from Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, this wine exudes classic Bordeaux style.</i>	£18.50
7	2006	Côtes-du-Rhône Villages 'Genets' <i>Very ethnic Rhône style – herbs, pepper and spices, and with a liquorice ('régliste') finish. Very correct. Gold Medal, Mâcon.</i>	£24.45
8	2001	Château Lestrille-Capmartin (Cru-Bourgeois Médoc) <i>Jean-Louis Roumage, the proprietor, is regarded as one of the greatest wine makers of France. The 2001 epitomises red Bordeaux at its most stylish.</i>	£24.80
9	2003	Château Haut-Maurac (Cru-Bourgeois Médoc) <i>An exquisitely mature claret with a classic nose and sublime flavours.</i>	£28.80
10	2002	Château Haut-Ballet 2002 (Canon-Fronsac) <i>Predominantly Merlot based this is rich and supple with an intense finish.</i>	£28.00
11	2003	Les Cèdres <i>The Château is in the Carcassonne region of southern France and is actually very Barolo/Barbaresco in style with all the class of a noble Centurion! Dark, complex and profound with all the potential to sabre through a gorgonzola!</i>	£28.80
12	2002	L'esprit de Pennautier (Cabardès) <i>The Château Petrus of the Languidoc. This wine has a Rodinesque structure, sinewy yet supple, with rich and intense tidal waves of southern 'garrigue', squeezed from black fruits, herbs, spice and black chocolate. An inspired and meditative drop.</i>	£32.70

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
